

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PERMANENT EXHIBITIONS



AUGUSTE RODIN

A gallery of 87 works by the great French master Auguste Rodin, considered the father of modern sculpture; includes bronzes, terracottas, plaster studies and watercolor sketches.



MARIE, QUEEN OF ROMANIA

Queen Marie of Romania (1875-1938), was a close friend of Sam Hill's and presided at the museum's dedication ceremony in 1926. Included are the Queen's elaborate coronation gown, crown, silverware, gilt furniture, jewelry and other memorabilia.

AMERICAN INDIAN GALLERIES

Explore the art and cultures of the indigenous peoples of North America through ancient petroglyphs, intricate baskets and bead work, and a vast array of artifacts from Pacific Northwest and North American tribes.



THÉÂTRE DE LA MODE

The fashions of post-World War II France are highlighted in this 1946 exhibit, which shows one-third human size mannequins wearing fashions created by the country's finest couture designers.

EXPANSIVE GROUNDS

Set within 5,300 acres of beautiful wild spaces and ranch lands, Maryhill's immediate grounds include the William and Catherine Dickson Sculpture Park, the Lewis and Clark Overlook (the museum is an official site on the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail) and a native plant garden.



INTERNATIONAL CHESS SETS

Explore more than 70 chess sets—sculptures in miniature—from the many countries, cultures and periods in which chess has been played.
